STUDENT ACHIEVEMENT

Students in kindergarten completed Fall 2020 KRA assessments. In addition, students in grades four and five will complete the South Carolina PASS or ALT assessments in science and social studies. To improve student achievement, administrators and staff will continue to focus on core instructional activities, which include implementation of Multi-Tiered Systems of Supports process for students who require academic assistance.



TEACHER QUALITY

To support teacher quality and retention, administrators and district level personnel emphasize specialized training opportunities through school, district, state, and online program offerings. In addition, the goal is to achieve 100% Highly Qualified status for all required personnel.



“READ TO SUCCEED PROGRAM”

The Read to Succeed Program includes the implementation of classroom based literacy programs, which includes 90 minutes of uninterrupted reading time, and a reading intervention program.
